Announcement of Executive Sessions

Ms. Feight said the Board met in Executive Session before this meeting on June 15, 2021 to discuss matters of personnel.

Public comments and concerns (limit of five minutes per individual)

There was no public comment

Commendation of Ashley Hughes for saving a choking victim on April 27th.

Chief Duffy said this commendation is for life saving actions on April 27, 2021. An 89-year-old female was eating cereal when she began to choke. Ms. Hughes, the victim's caregiver quickly jumped into action and performed the Heimlich maneuver on the victim which successfully cleared her airway. Upper Gwynedd Police and the Fire Department's quick response service responded to the call. Ms. Hughes was commended for her quick-thinking actions which prevented the situation from worsening.

MS-4 Presentation by Isaac Kessler, Township Engineer

Mr. Kessler presented an overview of the Township's Stormwater Management Plan (MS-4). The MS-4 or Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System plan keeps separate the water that flows to our creeks and streams from the water that flows to our Sewer Treatment Plant. Our NPDES permit controls how stormwater is managed prior to it flowing to a waterway.

The permit requires a series of six (6) minimum control measures.

- Public Education and Outreach which includes pamphlet, website and presentations
- Public Involvement and Participation may consist of volunteer groups that help care for the health of the streams or participate in Earth Day, Arbor Day and Tree Planting events
- Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination measures how the bad stuff is kept out of the streams with basin inspections, outfall inspections and upgrading the storm sewer map in GIS
- Construction Site Runoff Control focuses on routine construction inspections and notice of Erosion & Sediment (E&S) violation issuance
- Post Construction Stormwater Management includes long term operation and maintenance plans for stormwater features and elements throughout the Township
- Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping include procedures for managing Township owned stormwater facilities

Other elements to the plan include Pollution Reduction Plan and Total Maximum Daily Load. This focuses on identifying impaired watersheds, mapping the storm sewer within the impaired area and developing a plan to reduce the pollutants (sediment, total phosphorus, and total nitrogen). We partner with Merck to plan out projects to address the issues of impaired waterways.

The last cycle was submitted to the DEP in 2019. At that time, several creeks were identified as being impaired. The Township has an approved plan to meet the reduction goal with streambank restorations and basin retrofits. We continue to update mapping to include new development. We also identified sources of sediment and continually work on ways to improve it.

Mrs. Zadell said RVE has instituted a useful spreadsheet that is a quarterly timeline of what needs to be done and when it needs to be completed.
