* 2. <u>Motion to ratify the Consulting Agreement between Larry Comunale and Upper</u> Gwynedd Township

Mr. Kroberger said since the departure of Mr. Lapinski, staff has pulled together to continue moving forward for the good of the community. He added, we will introduce Larry Comunale at the Public Meeting. Mr. Kroberger stated that Mr. Comunale comes to the Township with over 36 years of experience in municipal government. He has been hired as a consultant to help Mr. Kaker with projects and day to day operations. Mr. Kroberger said Mr. Kaker is the interim Township Manager until the position is filled.

Hearing no questions or comments, upon motion by Mr. Kroberger, seconded by Mrs. Hull the motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Comunale commented that he is impressed with the staff and is happy to be here.

 This is for the Giant retail site. Signage has yet to be determined and a sign package will be presented to the ZHB next week. A discussion ensued among the Board about having Special Counsel present at the ZHB meeting.

Mr. Kaker to let Mr. Garrity know about the possibility of an appearance at the ZHB Mr. Rieker said he will send the sign package to Mr. Garrity. Mr. Santi suggested we let the ZHB handle the signage package. Mr. Rieker said it is a complex package but declined to comment further as he is recused from the matter. Mr. Onorato said the ZHB has been conservative in the past on signage.

Mr. Rieker said this is for a decision based on the hearing that was held last month and is for a text amendment only. This was recommended for approval by the Planning Commission. Mr. Santi commented that he doesn't agree with the limits and wants it to extend to Church Rd.

Mr. Onorato added, that once this is approved, we can begin the process of the map amendment.

* 6. <u>Colorcon Preliminary/Final Land Development Approval:</u> 420 Moyer Blvd. Decision

Mr. Rieker said there are no zoning issues or any other outstanding issues. The new plans are based on best management practices. Mr. Benner added they are decreasing the impervious surface and are providing two (2) bio-retention areas and two (2) infiltration trenches to help manage the stormwater.

A discussion ensued regarding the issues in the parking lot of the Wawa at Sumneytown and Valley Forge Rd. Mr. Rieker said they have been cited in the past for certain issues. He spoke with the owners and told them the parking lot needs to be improved, but nothing has happened yet. The discussion continued as to the history of the property. Mr. Onorato said they have to comply with the property maintenance code. Mr. Quimby will inspect the property and Mr. Rieker to see if there are any current zoning violations with the property.

Mr. Onorato to complete the Land Development Resolution.

- Ivy / Grannery MS-4 Project Update
 The National Fish and Wildlife Federation (NFWF) is transferring \$182,000 from the grant to the Sweetbriar Basin Project.
- Swedesford Rd. SEPTA Bridge Inspection Status
 Mr. Benner said we are meeting Thursday with representatives from Lower Gwynedd
 Township regarding the cost sharing of the bridge project.
- Sumneytown Pike Bridge
 - Mr. Benner is getting a proposal together for the cost of this project. Sumneytown Pike bridge is the priority to be done in 2019. The Swedesford Rd. bridge is next with resurfacing of the road in 2019 and the bridgework done in 2020. The Prospect Avenue bridge is further down the road. Mr. Kaker said the resurfacing of the Swedesford Rd. bridge should run approximately \$125,000. Lower Gwynedd Township should cover half of the cost. He added he will recommend that the budget is approved as advertised with some budget changes regarding the bridge project.

PUBLIC SAFETY

* 24. **2019 Security Service Agreement with Schneider Electric:** \$4,763 for the year Decision

Mr. Kaker said this is for the code readers on the doors and the timing of the automatic doors. Chief Duffy said our software is outdated and we are looking to update it in 2020. Mr. Kaker noted a minor increase in the cost of the contract from last year.

25. <u>Do Not Knock List and Regulations Ordinance</u> Discussion

Mr. Kaker said residents can sign up for the Do Not Knock list and if solicitors violate the Do Not Knock list, they can be cited, and their permits pulled.

This will be the agenda for authorization to advertise the Ordinance.

26. Ordinance Prohibiting the use of Brake Retarders: Sumneytown Pike between Prospect Avenue and Swedesford Road.

Discussion

Mr. Kaker said brake retarders are already prohibited in several areas of the Township. Mr. Onorato said we have had some complaints from residents on Sumneytown Pike recently. He noted this ordinance adds to the existing ordinance to include this section of road.

This will be on the agenda for authorization to advertise the Ordinance.

PUBLIC WORKS/PARKS/RECREATION

27. <u>Bamboo Regulations Ordinance</u> Discussion

Mr. Kaker said this for regulating bamboo and not prohibiting it. Mr. Onorato said an ordinance to prohibit bamboo has been challenged in the past as unconstitutional and restrictive. The growth and location of the bamboo can be regulated to control the roots and the location as such that it doesn't affect sight lines and sidewalks. He also said the ordinance defines the types of bamboo.

This will be on the agenda for authorization to advertise the Ordinance.

28. <u>Dickerson Road request for name change</u> Update/Discussion

Mr. Kaker talked to Gina Craigo of the WVWA to see if they will allow space to put a marker on their property. We are awaiting their reply.

Mr. Benner reported the punchlist is complete. There is no maintenance bond with this contract because it is not permitted with liquid fuels.
