Manager's Report (Sandra Zadell)

As Reported by Sandra Zadell, Township Manager

Mrs. Zadell reported on the Parks and Recreation activities. She said the gnome (our Township mascot) has been traveling around town and was seen in many locations. We are asking residents to submit names for our gnome. She announced that we are offering free Zumba classes online. We are hosing on online Woodlands Program offered by the Natural Lands Trust on December 9. Please see the website for additional information for any of the programs. Mrs. Zadell announced the Township is open but operating by appointment only.

7. Planning and Zoning Report (E. Van Rieker)

As reported by Van Rieker, Zoning Officer

 ZHB 20-07 – WB Homes – use variance request to develop Jeppy Property, Sumneytown Pike for 24 apartment units.

The applicant has met with neighbors and will be submitting a revised plan for review by the Board

- 593 Dekalb Pike, Conditional Use Hearing, Tesla Charging Stations. Hearings held on September 14 and 29, 2020. Approved by the BOC on September 29, 2020.
 Tesla modified the plans in such a way that violates the Zoning Code and the applicant now needs a dimensional variance. This will be discussed at the Plan Review Committee meeting. This may need to be reviewed by the Zoning Hearing Board for the relief needed.
- State Street, Roosevelt Court Conditional Use Hearing, 9-lot subdivision. Hearing held on September 29, 2020. Approved by the BOC on September 29, 2020 subject to staff review and issuance of building permit. Reduced rear yards deferred.
 The applicant received a preliminary opinion from the Zoning Officer regarding the rezoning of the property. Two ads are scheduled with a thirty (30) day comment process, then the land development plan can proceed.
- Engineering Report (Isaac Kessler)

. Haines Run Streambank Improvements

Some work has already been done at the WWTP with berm and streambank improvements near the gate access. This has significantly improved the protection of the WWTP from rising water levels at this location. Additional work is being designed for upstream controls for long-term flood mitigation.

Road Program

Remington Vernick Engineers (RVE) is coordinating with the Public Works Department for ADA curb ramps and roadways to be part of the bid package for next year's program. The Board will consider the authorization to advertise the Roads Program bid this evening.

North Wales Road Trail Crossing Improvements

RVE is working with the Public Works Department for layout of improved pedestrian safety and signage for vehicles and doing survey and design of the Green Ribbon Trail crossing North Wales Road.
