2014 CARNIVAL SEPTEMBER 4TH-7TH

pper Gwynedd Township has changed the Annual Carnival dates to the weekend immediately following Labor Day. This year's Carnival will begin on September 4th and will conclude on the afternoon of September 7th with fireworks on the evenings of the 5th and the 6th weather permitting. This change in dates was done for two primary reasons. The date change will help to avoid conflicts with certain religious holidays. The date change moves the Carnival to the first week that most schools are just opening for the new school year. This new date is a multi-year commitment between the Township and Skelly Amusements.

As has been our tradition, the Annual Carnival is a safe family event that also

helps multiple nonprofit organizations in our community raise funds. Proceeds from ticket sales benefit Upper Gwynedd Township Parks and Recreation facilities. WHAT IS THE EMERALD ASH BORER?

Agrilus Planipennis Fairmaire, the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB), a beetle native to Asia, was first detected in Michigan



in 2002. Evidence suggests that the beetle was established in Michigan for years prior to its discovery. EAB has since been detected in many states including Pennsylvania. In addition to spreading by natural means, EAB can be transported to new areas in infested firewood, timber, and nursery stock. This beetle has been responsible for the loss of millions of ash trees in North America. New infestations are difficult to detect, as damage to the tree may not be apparent for up to three years. Symptoms of an infestation can include branch dieback in the upper crown, excessive epicormic branching on the tree trunk, and vertical bark splits. Woodpecker damage is sometimes apparent.

Protect Our Forests and Trees:

Do not move firewood!

EAB can be spread when infested firewood is transported to new areas.

Use LOCAL firewood!

Do not bring firewood into Pennsylvania. This is banned under order of quarantine.

• If you have already transported firewood, do not take it home, do not leave it—burn it!

SAFETY INFORMATION FROM THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR

rom an Emergency Management standpoint, the primary threat to Upper Gwynedd Township has historically been flooding and wind. There are sections of the Township that are prone to flooding, and may make travel difficult in the event that multiple roads are closed or impassable. Residents should learn alternate routes in the event of such an emergency.

Wind events, such as thunderstorms or hurricanes can cause problems in the Township bringing down trees and/or wires, creating a hazard to all who are nearby. As we have learned from recent storms, there are times that the power grid is damaged and residents may go for days without electricity. While this is difficult to handle on many fronts, everyone should

be prepared in the event this happens again. With hurricane season in full swing, Upper Gwynedd may once again be in the path or aftermath of a storm. The potential is there for heavy rains, flooding, and damaging winds. Keep you and your family prepared for these events by storing a three day supply of goods for each family member in your household. The link below has been provided by the American Red Cross and has important information on creating an adequate supply of needs for you and your family. It is important to note that this supply should be kept up-to-date with each season, as emergencies can occur at any time throughout the year. 🦠

FROM THE CHIEF OF POLICE

The Police Department is proud to announce that they recently earned their third re-accreditation through the Pennsylvania Law Enforcement Accreditation Commission, Accreditation is a progressive and time-proven way of helping Police Departments evaluate and improve their overall performance. Only 8% of police agencies in Pennsylvania have obtained and maintained this prestigious status. The Department was first accredited under Chief Robert Freed in 2005.

The Police Department hopes that you enjoyed your summer. Please remember to drive with extra caution when school starts again in the Fall, and be mindful of school zones and busses. And remember... you can assist the Police Department in reducing crime simply by keeping your car and home doors locked.

LEAF AND YARD WASTE PROGRAM

Residential waste haulers will be collecting leaf and yard waste again this Fall. You should be receiving written notification of these dates from your hauler. Residents are advised that they should purchase their own bio-degradable leaf and yard waste collection bags and that haulers are responsible for the collection. Haulers may reject leaf and yard waste in plastic bags or bags that are contaminated with other trash and may limit the number of bags per collection.

Upper Gwynedd Township does not dictate whether or not your hauler bills you for this service. Further, haulers have been advised that they should not charge homeowners who live within developments where the Homeowners' Association contracts privately for the collection and disposal of leaf and yard waste.

Residents are also advised that the Barnside Farm Composting Facility on Haldeman Road in Lower Salford Township provides a drop off site for leaves, grass, and yard waste. Call 610-287-8880 for information.

INFORMATION ABOUT SNOW EMERGENCIES

Pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance 61-2, as amended, of the Township, during periods of emergency snow conditions, no person shall park a vehicle or permit a vehicle to stand unattended upon any portion of any of the roads within the Township. This is to assist snow plow operators in clearing the streets.

A snow emergency shall be declared by the Township Manager and announced over the radio stations WNPV 1440 and KYW 1060.

As a courtesy to the Township's snow plow operators and neighboring residents, The Township requests that residents refrain from putting out trash and recycling containers that also hinder snow removal efforts. Thank you!

IMPORTANT MAILBOX PLACEMENT ANNOUNCEMENT

Township work crews have reported that many residents have mailboxes that protrude over the face of the curb and/ or over the paved area of Township roads. The Township is taking this opportunity to notify residents that this causes problems during snow removal and/or road resurfacing efforts undertaken by the Township. Mailboxes must be installed or reinstalled so that they are even with the back (behind the curb to the property side) of the curb line and/or beyond the edge of the black top where curbs do not exist.During the winter months when snow plowing operations are taking place, the opportunity that your mailbox could be hit by a plow will be minimized by complying with these regulations. Also in the summer months when paving operations take place, the paving equipment must be even with the curb. By having your mailbox meet these requirements, once again, the chance of your mailbox being hit will be minimal. Please be advised that should your mailbox not meet the above requirements and damage is done by a Township vehicle or contractor, you will not be compensated nor will your mailbox be replaced. 🥞

Nor-Gwyn Pool Adds Slides!

he Nor-Gwyn Pool Commission is excited to offer another attraction for its patrons' enjoyment! Installation of a double flume slide began in early June and was opened at the beginning of regular summer hours on Saturday June 21, 2014. The slide features two flumes; a corkscrew that starts at 12 feet high and a "J" shaped slide that starts at 10 feet high. The slides are designed for children as well as nimble adults, and they provide an added attraction for some of our kids who are not yet able to use Nor-Gwyn's WIBIT obstacle course and spinner. With these flumes the

smaller sliders fall more gently into the water than the bigger sliders.

The slide design uses platforms instead of ladders to get to the top; and the climbing area and structural pieces are all encased in a rigid mesh

which prevents both falls off the platforms and climbing areas.

New Slide Installation

A 2011 survey conducted by the Nor-Gwyn Pool Commission prior to its repair and refurbishment project indicated that there was a high demand for a

slide. Reviews from both adults and kids who have used the slides have been great!

Nor-Gwyn pool operates from Memorial Day through Labor Day.




