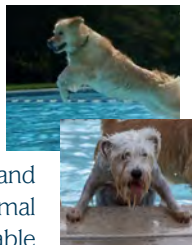

Nor-Gwyn Pool Activities include swim and dive lessons, competition training, beach volleyball, water basketball, land basketball, GAGA and tetherball. July 4th is a festive day of old fashioned fun at Nor-Gwyn that includes pie-eating contests, gold fish catch, egg toss, WIBIT races, penny toss, candy scramble and more. Both the facility and staff are re-decked in red-white-and blue for the 4th.

The **WIBIT inflatables** continue to be crowd pleasers for both users and spectators! The 54 foot obstacle course and the two deep water attractions will return again this year. Updated floor anchoring has made the obstacle course even more challenging.

Pooch Plunge is held annually the Saturday after Labor Day. It's a day for the dogs. Admission fees, vendor contributions, and donations of pet supplies and cash are taken to area animal shelters. It's a truly enjoyable experience—whether or not you have a pooch.



Improvements put in place this season include a new website and improved online registration system, which the Pool Commission hopes will streamline both registration and facility entry for patrons and staff alike. Residents can also register via mail or at the pool during operating hours.



Membership rates have not increased! There is a membership level to suit everyone's needs. Frequent attendance or just evenings and weekend packages are available. The Nor-Gwyn Pool Commission strives to keep membership affordable for the community while operating solely on income from memberships and facility rentals.

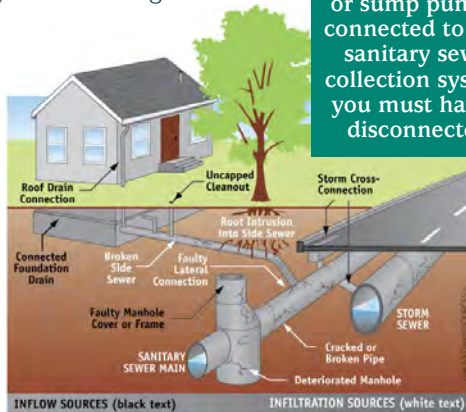
THE SEWER DEPARTMENT CONTINUES TO REDUCE GROUNDWATER ENTERING THE SEWER SYSTEM

Many sewer improvement projects were completed in 2013 as part of the Township's continued efforts to reduce groundwater infiltration into the Sanitary Sewer System. These projects included the installation of 2,030 feet of 16 inch PVC sewer main and 11 new manholes in the sewer collection system's East Interceptor. Other projects throughout the Township included new manholes, manhole rehabilitation, sewer main repairs, and sewer lateral repairs. In addition to the Township's projects, many residents in Gwyneddeer also completed repairs to the sewer laterals that service their homes. The Township appreciates the cooperation that the Township staff, engineers, and construction contractors received from residents during the completion of these projects. Sewer improvement projects planned for 2014 include the lining of 11,500 ft. of clay sewer mains and the rehabilitation of 39 brick manholes in the Merrybrook development. Similar projects on a smaller scale are also planned in the Sugar Valley development and on S. Broad Street.

In addition to the sewer improvement projects, the Sewer Department and Public Works Department will continue to perform home inspections that include verifying that sump pumps and downspouts are not connected to the Sanitary Sewer Collection System. All of these efforts have helped to significantly reduce the amount of clear groundwater entering the sanitary sewers during rain events.

Residents can continue to assist the Sewer Department in reducing groundwater from entering the collection system simply by checking into the following:

1. Is the vent stack and cap in your yard broken?
2. Where does your sump pump discharge water from your basement?
3. Where do your downspouts discharge rain water?



If a downspout or sump pump is connected to your sanitary sewer collection system, you must have it disconnected!

By verifying that these three items on your property are properly connected and not contributing to an increase in groundwater entering the sewer system, you will be helping to control the cost of sewage treatment, protecting the environment, and protecting your home from unnecessary sewage backups. NOR-GWYN BASEBALL & SOFTBALL OPENING DAY IS APRIL 12, 2014

The 2014 Nor-Gwyn season begins on Saturday, April 12 with several Baseball, Softball, and T-Ball games. The annual Opening Day player parade and ceremony will immediately precede the games at 10:30am sharp. The ceremony will be held on the Bachman-Jasinski Field at the Nor-Gwyn Complex on Hancock Road in Upper Gwynedd Township. Everyone is invited to join in celebrating the start of the new season. The ceremony will include remarks by Nor-Gwyn officials and presentations of the Ben Hostelley Scholarship and Larry Meyers Coach-of-the-Year awards. State and local government officials are expected to be in attendance. The ceremony also includes the traditional First Baseball AND Softball pitches. ALL Nor-Gwyn Baseball and Softball players and coaches are invited to participate in the ceremony by assembling behind the Bachman-Jasinski Field outfield fence in full uniform promptly at 10:15am. THE BIO MAG SYSTEM & IMPROVED WATER QUALITY

Upper Gwynedd Township (UGT) is always seeking to make improvements to its wastewater treatment plant (WWTP). This is done in an effort to increase operating efficiency and enhance the quality of water discharged to the Wissahickon Creek.

In January of 2014, UGT completed construction of an innovative treatment process at its WWTP. This process is called the Bio Mag System. The system was successfully pilot tested by UGT in 2009. This system is the first of its kind to

be installed and successfully operating in the greater Philadelphia area. Through the efforts of the UGT Board of Commissioners, State Senator Stewart Greenleaf, and State Representative Kate Harper, UGT received a significant Grant from the state that greatly helped project financing.

The system utilizes inert iron particles (magnetite) to improve gravity settling of biological solids in secondary clarifiers. Using a variety of mechanical equipment, the magnetite is embedded in the biological

solids which significantly increases their specific gravity. The higher specific gravity greatly improves the settling efficiency of solids in the clarifiers. This not only improves the quality of the effluent discharged to the Wissahickon Creek, but it allows for a greater volume of wastewater to be processed. This significantly increases the effective capacity of the UGT WWTP.

The Bio Mag System has been successfully operating for several months, and UGT has been reaping the benefit of improved water quality.

This winter was particularly harsh on our area. While we used multiple platforms to notify

the public during events, we have taken a few steps to ensure better communication between the Emergency Management Agency and the public. First, if you are a Twitter user, you can now follow us @ **UGTEMA** for up-to-date alerts and domestic preparedness information. For those without a Twitter account, you can sign up for alerts at <https://montco.alertpa.org/>. When signing up at the Montco Alert website, be sure to choose the alerts for Upper Gwynedd as well as the municipality where you work. This will ensure that you receive up-to-date information whether you are at home or at work. In the near future, every household and business within the Township will receive a pamphlet regarding Emergency Management and steps to prepare yourself, your family, and your employees for an emergency situation. Grilling Safety

In order to keep your barbeque safe and enjoyable for your family and friends, please adhere to the

following guidelines. For one and two family dwellings, it is recommended that you keep your grill at least 10' away from any combustible construction. For townhomes, row homes, apartment buildings, or condominiums this is mandatory per the Fire Code. Please remember that wood or composite decking is considered combustible. The only exception is if your deck or balcony is protected by an automatic sprinkler system. A small "Coleman style" Liquefied Propane (LP) grill with a capacity of 2 ½ lbs. is also permitted with a sprinkler system. Keep children and pets away and never leave your cooking unattended. If using a charcoal grill, make sure that the ashes are cool before disposing of them. If using LP, ensure that your gas is turned off once your cooking is completed. 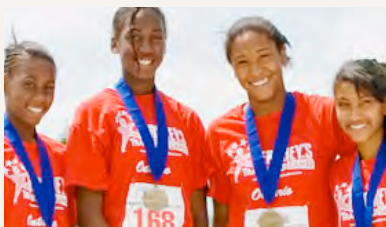

The Yankees-Red Sox rivalry is one of the most storied in all of sports. It began in 1919, when Harry Frazee, the financially troubled Red Sox owner, sold Babe Ruth to the Yankees for \$125,000. The Red Sox became a star-crossed band of lovable losers. They reached the World Series only four more times before their 2004 win, losing each in dramatic fashion. The Sox gave away victory, to the endless frustration of their fans. They redeemed themselves in small fashion winning the World Series in 2007 and 2013. Meanwhile, the Yankees became the most successful team in baseball. Through the year 2013, they won 27 World Series titles. They produced countless Hall of Fame players, including legends such as Mickey Mantle and Joe DiMaggio. Playing in the same division, the teams faced each other often. The teams divided neighbors, colleagues, and families. Red Sox fans blamed the Yankees for all of their problems, and Yankees fans gloated in return. Now, though the Yankees still hold a significant edge in World Series titles, both teams are among the most elite in baseball. They are the only teams to win multiple World Series in the past decade. Because both are now competitive, regular-season games are more important and fraught with tension than ever.
