POOL ADDS FEATURES & LESSONS FOR TOTS



The Nor-Gwyn Pool 2015 season will debut a completely upgraded Tot Pool and introduce a proven swim instruction program that will include our younger members. The new Tot Pool enhancements include a zero depth entry area to help little ones safely enter the water, a spray feature and a rain structure for entertainment, and new pool surfacing and decking.

Our new swim instruction program is a results oriented, proven program offered by The University of Swimming. Toilet trained tots are included in the beginner level of this instruction program, which focuses on teaching techniques of self-rescue to the very young.

More advanced instruction levels teach strokes, breathing, endurance, etc. Swim instruction will be offered in 3 two week sessions of up to 60 minutes each beginning July 2nd from 9-11 am. Membership is no longer required to participate in the instruction program. Registration and additional information can be found at USwim1.com.

Additional enhancements this season include the return of water basketball and a new barcode badge access system designed to increase security and reduce fraud. All members will receive a new barcoded badge this year as part of the initialization of the system.

The double flume slide and WIBIT inflatables continue to provide amusement for users and spectators alike! The 54 foot obstacle course and two deep water attractions return this year. Additional activities include dive lessons, competition training with Nor-Gwyn Aquatics Club, beach volleyball, GAGA, and tetherball. Our traditional July 4th celebration is a festive day of pie-eating contests, gold fish catch, egg toss, swim relays, WIBIT races, and more.

Pooch Plunge, held annually the Saturday after Labor Day, is a day for dogs. Admission fees, vendor contributions, and donations all go to area animal shelters.

A variety of membership levels are available. Whether you plan on attending frequently or just evenings and weekends, there is a membership level that will suit your needs. Once again, this year there will be **NO** increase in membership fees. 🐾

NOR-GWYN BASEBALL & SOFTBALL OPENING DAY APRIL 11TH

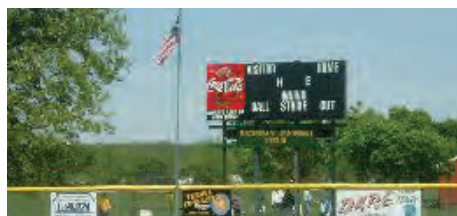


The 2015 Nor-Gwyn season begins on Saturday, April 11 with several Baseball, Softball, and T-Ball games. The annual Opening Day player parade and ceremony will immediately precede the games at 10:30 am sharp. The ceremony will be held at the Nor-Gwyn Complex on Hancock Road in Upper Gwynedd Township. Everyone is invited to come out to celebrate the start of the new season.

The ceremony will include remarks by Nor-Gwyn officials and presentations of the Ben Hostelley Scholarship, Larry Meyers Coach-of-the-Year, and the first-ever Volunteer award. State and local government officials are expected to be on-hand. The ceremony also includes the traditional First Baseball AND Softball Pitches.

All Nor-Gwyn Baseball and Softball players and coaches are invited to participate in the ceremony by assembling behind the Bachman-Jasinski Field outfield fence in full uniform promptly at 10:15 am. Players and coaches will line-up and parade onto the field by team to start the ceremony.

The rain date for the ceremony is Sunday, April 12 at 12:15 pm. If weather or field conditions require postponement, a message will be posted on the Nor-Gwyn answering service (267-217-2567) after 9:30 am.



UPPER GWYNEDD DESIGNATES NORTH WALES AREA LIBRARY

At the January 2015 Board of Commissioners meeting, the North Wales Area Library (NWAL) was designated as the official Library of Upper Gwynedd Township. This designation follows a detailed review of the demographic use of the NWAL. This review revealed that most Upper Gwynedd residents who use library services are utilizing the NWAL more commonly than any other Library in the County. With Upper Gwynedd's designation the NWAL will receive Commonwealth of Pennsylvania funding that it did not previously receive.

Upper Gwynedd residents should know that by joining this Library they not only receive access to this Library but they are also permitted access to the Montgomery County Library in Norristown and any other Library within the Pennsylvania Library System.



The North Wales Area Library is located at 233 South Swartley Street in the Borough of North Wales. Our Township Newsletter frequently contains information on events and program offerings (*Please see page 8 for these details*).

INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

The Industrial Development Authority (IDA) donated \$15,000 to be used by the Township to fund two emergency service radios for the Police Department, to install magnetic locks in the concession building bathrooms for the Parks and Recreation Department, and to partially fund recommended website upgrades for the Administration Department.

The Upper Gwynedd Township IDA assists 501(c)3 organizations in borrowing money for capital projects at discounted interest rates. Anyone knowing a 501(c)3 organization that is looking to raise capital via a borrowing, should refer that organization to the Upper Gwynedd IDA via Township Manager Len Perrone. 🌿

THUNDER AND LIGHTNING SAFETY FROM THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR

With the coming summer season, there will be thunderstorms that move through our area. Each year in the United States, approximately 600 people are injured by lightning strikes and on average 51 people are killed from direct strikes. In addition, countless other victims suffer from indirect causes such as fires and fallen trees. Remember: *When Thunder Roars, Go Indoors!* Additional lightning safety information can be found at www.lightningsafety.noaa.gov. Please review this important safety information to protect you and your family when thunderstorms occur:

LIGHTNING CAN STRIKE UP TO 10 MILES FROM A STORM CELL.

Indoor Safety

- Turn off computers. Stay off corded phones, computers, and other things that put you in direct contact with electricity. You can use a cell or cordless phone.
- Wait at least 30 minutes after you hear the last clap of thunder before leaving your shelter.
- Do not come in direct contact with plumbing. Do not wash your hands, bathe, shower, or wash laundry or dishes.
- While inside, stay away from windows and doors and off porches.
- If a person is struck by lightning, call 911 and get medical assistance right away.

Outdoor Safety

- If you can hear thunder, you are within striking distance of lightning. Look for shelter inside a home, large building, or hard topped vehicle immediately.
- Do not go under trees for shelter. There is no outside place that is safe during a thunderstorm.

PUBLIC WORKS ANNOUNCEMENTS

Trees within the Public Street Right-of-Way

Public Works' crews have noticed that there are property owners who have trees protruding into the Township's Roadway. Tree limbs are a problem during paving operations and snow plowing operations as well as a serious problem for emergency vehicles. The Township requires that property owners trim any trees that extend beyond the house side of the sidewalk. At a minimum trees should be trimmed even with the back of the curb line and/or beyond the edge of the black top where curbs do not exist.

No Dumping in Open Space

Open Space is defined as a parcel or parcels of land, an area of water or a combination of land and water within a development site designed and intended for the use of Township residents for the purpose of passive recreation (i.e. bird watching and hiking).

Public Works crews have noticed that property owners are disposing leaf and yard waste along with other materials in Open Space areas.



According to Section 127-3 of the Township Code this is considered a nuisance and requires remedial action. This can also require payment to the Township for incurred expenses, violations, and penalties. 🌿

EVANS-MUMBOWER MILL PROGRAMS

WISSAHICKON VALLEY

WATERSHED AUTHORITY (WVWA)



Owned by the Wissahickon Valley Watershed Association, the Mill dates back to

the 19th century and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. It is the only fully operational water-powered gristmill in Montgomery County, PA. Come visit and feel the excitement of rumbling stones, hear the splash of water over the wheel, and witness the cornmeal as it spills down a chute and into a barrel below. Open Houses feature the operational water wheel, grindstone, and other related activities. The Mill is located at Swedesford and Township Line Roads in Upper Gwynedd Township.
