UPPER GWYNEDD TOWNSHIP 2015 BUDGET APPROVAL

The Upper Gwynedd Township Board of Commissioners is pleased to announce that at their November 24, 2014, Public Meeting the 2015 Preliminary Budget was authorized for advertisement. The Budget is based on the same real estate tax level that was in place in 2014 at 2.012 mills of assessed value. At the rate of 2.012 mills, the owner of a home assessed at the Township's average pays \$247 annually. The Township Board of Commissioners reauthorized the Homestead Exemption which further reduces the real estate tax burden on owner occupied residential properties. In addition, the Budget reflects the same sewer rates that were in place in 2014 at a rate of \$370.00 per year.

In summary, the Budget includes a balanced spending plan that includes revenues and expenditures as follows:

General Fund	\$12,054,686
Sewer Fund	\$4,405,315
Sewer Revenue Acct.	\$1,574,098
Liquid Fuels Fund.....	\$634,000
Sewer Expansion Fund	\$340,000

In addition to normal operation and maintenance expenses, the Budget includes the following major capital projects:

- **General Fund:** West Point Streetscape Project (\$430k - \$300k from a grant), Police patrol vehicle replacements (\$64k), Road milling & overlay projects (\$1,032k - \$634k from State), Storm Water Drainage Projects (\$184k - \$134k grants), Public Works Dump Truck replacement (\$180k), and Playground and Trail Improvements (\$94k).
- **Sewer Fund:** The continuation of the Upper Gwynedd Township Inflow/Infiltration Reduction Program (\$300k), Vacuum Truck replacement (\$370k), Storage Garage (\$100k), and Service Truck replacement (\$45k).
- **Sewer Revenue Account:** The continuation of the Upper Gwynedd Township Inflow/ Infiltration Reduction Program (\$325k).
- **Sewer Expansion Fund:** UV Algae Screen (\$340k).

The Board of Commissioners President Kenneth E. Kroberger thanked all the Members of the Board, Township Manager Leonard T. Perrone, Township Finance Director David Brill, Assistant Township Manager Michael J. Lapinski, and all of the Department Heads for their diligence through the Budget preparation process. He indicated that many difficult choices were made in a successful effort to develop a Budget which held the line without a tax or sewer utility fee increase. In addition, the budget maintains the reserves of the Township at an appropriate level to maintain its AA + S&P Credit Rating as required to fund unforeseen needs. ❄️

Nor-Gwyn announces the opening of registration for all 2015 programs. There are two ways to register for returning players. Walk-in sign-ups will be held on Friday, January 9, Saturday, January 10, Friday, January 16, and Saturday, January 17 at the Upper Gwynedd Township Building.

Nor-Gwyn Pool held its 4th Annual Pooch Plunge on Saturday, September 6th, raising over \$1,800 in food and toy donations for the Montgomery County SPCA. This event is open to all members of the community. There is a nominal charge of \$10.00 per dog or \$5.00 per dog if donating dog food at the event.

Each year for four hours the pools and pool grounds are opened to dogs for swimming and socializing, and the facility is one of the happiest places on the planet! Many guests have attended every year and, according to their families, the pups now get excited as soon as they turn in off Sumneytown Pike. Attendance grew again this year to include 198 dogs and their families.



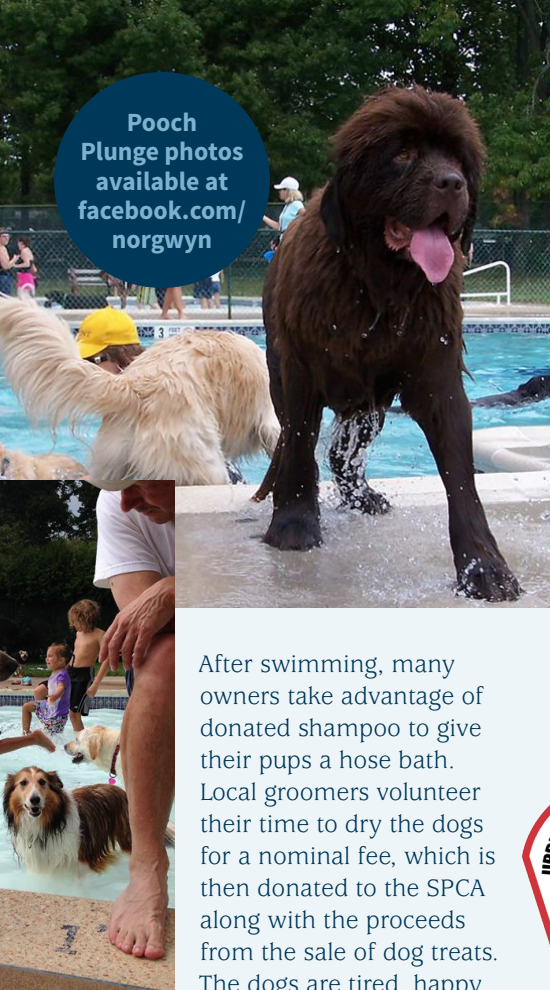
