TOWNSHIP RECEIVES STORMWATER BASIN GRANTS

In May, the Township received notice from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania that it had received a grant in the amount of \$305,000 from the Growing Greener Fund. In addition, on July 1, 2016, the Township received a second piece of great news that it had been awarded an additional grant from the Commonwealth Finance Authority in the amount of \$274,000. These two grants totaling \$579,000 will be used towards funding the construction of three Water Quality Basins at or near the intersection of North Wales Road and Hancock Road. These basins will help to eliminate downstream flooding conditions that are experienced by property owners living in the Dickerson Road neighborhood. In addition, these basins will serve to improve water quality in the upper reaches of the Wissahickon Creek. The Township recently received bids for this project. It is anticipated that the project will be awarded at the July Public Meeting of the Board of Commissioners. A Public Meeting will be held with neighboring property owners to explain the project and its construction timeline. The Township wishes to thank the North Penn School District for its cooperation in providing land necessary to construct two of the three basins. The Township appreciates the support provided by State Senator Stewart Greenleaf and State Representative Kate Harper in acquiring these grants.

MONTGOMERY COUNTY POLICE CHIEFS ASSOCIATION

The purpose of the Montgomery County Police Chiefs Association is to secure a closer official and personal relationship among police officials throughout the County of Montgomery to secure unity of action in police matters, to elevate the standards of police officials, to adopt humane efforts in the enforcement of laws, to devise and suggest ways and means for advancement and perfection of a uniform police system, to promote cooperation in the prevention and detection of crime, and to advance police officials' education throughout the County of Montgomery. As one of his last official duties before his unexpected and sad passing, Commissioner Eugene P. Ziemba attended the Montgomery County Police Chiefs banquet to support Chief Duffy as the incoming President of the Chiefs Association.

A MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE MARSHAL

While we encourage fire prevention throughout the year, Fire Prevention week is normally held the second week of October to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire of 1871. This year's theme is "Don't Wait, Check the Date!" Smoke Alarms should be replaced every 10 years. Since 1999, all new Smoke Alarms must have the manufactured date noted on the back of the unit. Prior to this year, these devices were coded with a 4-5 digit serial number so if yours does not specify a date it needs to be replaced. Any Smoke Alarm manufactured before September 2006 should also be replaced. All too often, fire departments across the Country respond to incidents where the homeowner reports that the Smoke Alarm failed to activate. Many times it is because the alarm itself is beyond its 10-year life cycle. Please keep you and your family safe by checking the dates on all your residential Smoke Alarms. Also, please remind your employer that the same 10-year life span applies to commercial Smoke Alarms, and they should be serviced annually. For more information, please visit www.fpw.org.

At the March 28, 2016, Public Meeting, the Board of Commissioners presented a Proclamation to Township resident Victoria K. Finley for achieving her Girl Scout Gold Award which is the highest achievement award within Girl Scouting. Victoria's Gold Award Project involved the improvement of the literacy rate of children at McCall Elementary School in Philadelphia. Through research, she learned that poverty can be directly linked to an individual's education level. TREES WITHIN THE PUBLIC STREET RIGHT-OF-WAY

Public Works' crews have noticed that there are property owners who have trees protruding into the Township's roadway right-of-way. Tree limbs are a problem during paving operations and snow plowing operations as well as a serious problem for emergency vehicles. The Township requests that property owners trim any trees that extend into the right-of-way of the street. At a minimum, trees should be trimmed even with the back of the curb line and/or beyond the edge of the black top where curbs do not exist. If a property owner fails to do so, the Township reserves the right to cut or remove these plantings at property owners' expense. If you have a sidewalk, tree limbs should be elevated to a height of not less than ten (10) feet above and at least one (1) foot behind the sidewalk.

LEAF AND YARD WASTE PROGRAM

Residential waste haulers will be collecting leaf and yard waste again this Fall. You should be receiving written notification of these dates from your hauler. Residents are advised that they should purchase their own biodegradable leaf and yard waste collection bags and that haulers are responsible for the collection. Haulers may reject leaf and yard waste in plastic bags or bags that are contaminated with other trash and may limit the number of bags per collection. Upper Gwynedd Township does not dictate whether or not your hauler bills you for this service. Further, haulers have been advised that they should not charge homeowners who live within developments where the Homeowners' Association contracts privately for the collection and disposal of leaf and yard waste. Residents are also advised that the Barnside Farm Composting Facility on Haldeman Road in Lower Salford Township provides a drop off site for leaves, grass and yard waste. SNOW EMERGENCY

Pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance 61-2, as amended, of the Township, during periods of emergency snow conditions, no person shall park a vehicle or permit a vehicle to stand unattended upon any portion of any of the roads within the Township. This is to assist snow plow operators in clearing the streets. A snow emergency shall be declared by the Township Manager and announced over the radio stations WNPV 1440 and KYW 1060. As a courtesy to the Township's snow plow operators and neighboring residents, The Township requests that residents refrain from putting out trash and recycling containers that also hinder snow removal efforts.



IMPORTANT MAILBOX PLACEMENT ANNOUNCEMENT

Township work crews have reported that many residents have mailboxes that protrude over the face of the curb and/or over the paved area of Township roads. The Township is taking this opportunity to notify residents that this causes problems during snow removal. Mailboxes must be installed or reinstalled so that they are even with the back (behind the curb to the property side) of the curb line and/or beyond the edge of the black top where curbs do not exist. During the winter months when snow plowing operations are taking place, the opportunity that your mailbox could be hit by a plow will be minimized by complying with these regulations. Please be advised that should your mailbox not meet the above requirements and damage is done by a Township vehicle or contractor, you will not be compensated nor will your mailbox be replaced.

FROM THE CHIEF OF POLICE

The Police Department hopes that you enjoyed your summer. Please remember to drive with extra caution when school starts again in the Fall, and be mindful of school zones and busses. As winter weather approaches, take your time in inclement conditions. As per state law, headlights must be on (not just daytime running lights) whenever windshield wipers are on. As always, help us prevent crime by locking your car and home doors. Please do not hesitate to call 9-1-1 to report any suspicious activity, even if you do not think it is an emergency. The Upper Gwynedd Township Police Department has a Drug Turn In Kiosk (for expired prescriptions) in the lobby of the Police Department and can be accessed during office hours 8:00am-4:30pm Monday through Friday and all other times by contacting the Upper Gwynedd Police Department at 215-699-5861.

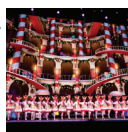
