UPPER GWYNEDD TOWNSHIP ADMINISTRATION PENNBROOK STORMWATER BASINS COMPLETED

embers of the Upper Gwynedd Township Board of Commissioners and staff met on Thursday July 20, 2017 with members of the North Penn School Board and their staff to commemorate the completion of the Pennbrook Stormwater and Environmental Quality Basins. Beginning in 2016, Upper Gwynedd Township built 3 stormwater control basins, two of which are situated on property owned by the North Penn School District at the Pennbrook Middle School. A third basin was constructed on property owned by the Township at the intersection of Hancock and North Wales Rds.

These basins were built to eliminate a downstream flooding problem that was being experienced by residents in the Dickerson Rd. neighborhood. In addition, these basins will promote groundwater recharge and will improve the water quality of the Wissahickon Creek, which is located downstream from the project. The project also included the improvement of sidewalks, which will help to provide a safer access to the school for students.

The project was made possible with the cooperation of the North Penn School District, who granted the necessary easements to construct two of the basins. The cooperation of PECO was also necessary in the form of drainage easements. The total construction cost of this project was \$931,396 and was made possible due to two grants that the Township received from the Commonwealth of PA, totaling \$574,000. In addition, Merck & Co. contributed \$45,000 to the project. The balance of the project was funded by the Township.

n a fire, seconds count. Seconds can mean the difference between residents of our community escaping safely from a fire or having their lives end in tragedy. That's why this year's Fire Prevention Week theme: "Every Second Counts: Plan 2 Ways Out!" is so important. It reinforces why everyone needs to have an escape plan. Here's this year's key campaign messages:

- Draw a map of your home with all members of your household, marking two exits from each room and a path to the outside from each exit.
- Practice your home fire drill twice a year. Conduct one at night and one during the day with everyone in your home, and practice using different ways out.
- Teach children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- Make sure the number of your home is clearly marked and easy for the fire department to find.
- Close doors behind you as you leave—this may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire.
- Once you get outside, stay outside. Never go back inside a burning building.

PERKIOMEN WATERSHED ASSOCIATION AWARD

n Wednesday, July 26, 2017, Upper Gwynedd Township was notified by the Perkiomen Watershed Association that the Township is the 2017 recipient of the Watershed's Municipal Award. This award is given to the most deserving municipality as judged by the Association's Awards Committee for the municipality's contribution towards the enhancement and improvement to the Perkiomen Watershed and its tributaries. Upper Gwynedd Township is one of 55 communities located in four counties that contributes flow to the Perkiomen Watershed. Upper Gwynedd Township is in the final stages of completing a 3-part project that is designed to enhance the water quality in the Zacharias Creek, a tributary of the Perkiomen Creek. This 3-phase project included the planting of a Riparian Buffer along the Zacharias Creek in the Gwynedeer neighborhood. The second phase of this project was the Conrad Avenue Basin rejuvenation with natural vegetation. This project will help recharge local water supplies, protect creek habitats and provide islands of wildlife habitat in suburban landscapes. Lastly, the Township is in the final stages of completing the Zacharias Creek Restoration Project. This project will realign a section of the Zacharias Creek that has experienced severe streambank erosion over the years. The new Stream Restoration Project will restore the natural flood plain away from private properties, decrease sediment pollution in the Zacharias Creek and enhance the riparian buffer along the new alignment.

All of these projects were built with grant funding acquired by the Township from



the Commonwealth of PA. Township Manager Len Perrone commended Assistant Township Manager, Michael Lapinski for his diligence and hard work through the permitting and construction phases of these projects.

Township Commissioners Clare Edelmayer and Steve Sands both commented on the Township for having received this award. Clare Edelmayer, Commissioner and serves as liaison on Park and Recreation and Open Space matters stated:

"It is truly an honor to be recognized by the Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy to receive the 2017 "Municipal Award" for the Township's work in improving the alignment of Zacharias Creek. Upper Gwynedd Township has been working hard with new Storm Water Regulations (MS-4) to reduce storm water runoff and to improve water quality in our streams and watersheds including both the Perkiomen and Wissahickon watersheds. This effort has also included providing education materials to our residents about the importance of environmental stewardship. This award demonstrates that our efforts have been noticed by both environmental agencies and advocacy groups."

The Township will receive this award at the annual Perkiomen Watershed Fundraising Gala that will be held in October.

Mailbox Placement


Mailboxes should be properly installed per USPS standards to prevent damage from snow plows.

Street Lights

If your street light is out, please contact the township administrative office at 215-699-7777, and we will contact the contractor for PECO to repair it.

Basketball Rims

Portable basketball rims should not be in the right of way or street to allow snow plows to get back to the curb for snow removal. They should be placed back on your property.



CODE ENFORCEMENT Heating Season is Approaching

As the heating season approaches it is the time to check your heater and its exhaust system for the most efficient operation before a breakdown occurs. If a chimney is present, the connection to the exhaust system should be checked to prevent possible health threats. The chimney should be examined for possible defects.

- Water heaters (if present) should be examined for the chimney connection to prevent the escape of gases similar to heaters.
- Fire places should be cleaned prior to winter use to prevent the buildup of materials that could possibly ignite.
- Water piping should be protected with insulation in areas that could freeze to prevent pressure cracks.
- Smoke alarm batteries should be changed to prevent malfunctions.
 An alarm should be installed on each level of the home, in each bedroom and in the area outside each bedroom.
- The most important reason for permits is to verify the proper installation of any equipment, device or structural member that the owner purchases and has installed.




SEWER DEPARTMENT SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

he sewer department has completed several improvement projects in 2017. During the month of April, Advanced Rehab Technologies completed the rehabilitation of 112 manholes that were sources of ground water infiltration into the sanitary sewers. In May, several sewer laterals were repaired that had root intrusions or faulty pipe connections on Green St., Rosemont Ave. and Church Rd. Additional projects will be completed on Swedesford Rd., Sumneytown Pike and at the Parkside Place Complex. All of the projects are completed in conjunction with the township engineers, contractors and the sewer department staff. Ultimately, these improvements will reduce the costs of treating wastewater at the Upper Gwynedd Township Wastewater Treatment Plant.







The above photos were taken with the township's sanitary sewer inspection cameras.

The photos show sections of broken pipe, groundwater entering the sewers from a house lateral and water entering a manhole prior to rehabilitation.

The goal of the projects is to continue to reduce the amount of clear ground water entering the sanitary sewers during rain events. Ground water infiltration into the sewers increases the cost of wastewater treatment, can cause unnecessary sewage back-ups into residents' homes and can pollute the local streams.

Residents can contribute to the reduction of groundwater entering the collection system by checking the sump pump, downspouts and the sewer vent for your home.



Raise the vent to 6" above ground level to meet the township sewer code and replace the cap.

By verifying that these three items on your property are properly connected and not contributing to an increase in groundwater entering the sewer system, you will be helping to control the cost of sewage treatment, protecting the environment and protecting your home from unnecessary sewage backups.


