TOWNSHIP COMPLETES NEW WATER QUALITY BASINS PROJECT

he Township has substantially completed three new water quality basins at the Pennbrook Middle School property, and on Township owned land at the corner of North Wales Road and Hancock Road. The initial purpose for constructing the basins was to address downstream neighborhood flooding that was occurring during severe rain events. The basins, however, are designed to not only slow the release of stormwater to Township waterways, but to also replenish groundwater supply, control stormwater pollution through native plantings, and promote a healthy wildlife habitat.

During the planning and design phase for the basins the Township partnered with the North Penn School District to obtain the necessary easements to construct two of the basins on the Pennbrook Middle School property. In addition, the Township obtained an easement from PECO to construct a stormwater runoff diversion berm within their power



transmission right of way. This diversion berm will help to significantly reduce flooding and icing on the North Wales Road sidewalks adjacent to the middle school.

Upon final design for the basins it was evident that not only would the project reduce downstream flooding events, but they would also address Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) storm water quality regulations. This made the project a strong candidate for State grant funding which ultimately awarded the Township a \$305,000 PADEP Growing Greener Watershed Protection grant, and \$274,000 Pennsylvania Department of Community and Economic Development (PADCED) Watershed Restoration and Protection grant. These grants, as well as a generous \$45,000 contribution from Merck and Company helped to fund over 65% of the project's construction cost.

The Township thanks the North Penn School District, Merck and Company, PECO, PA DEP and DCED, and its residents for partnering to make this project a success.

Upper Gwynedd Township Administration Jeff Mullaly Appointed as Deputy Fire Marshal

t the February 27, 2017 Board of Commissioners Public Meeting, District Justice Robert Sobeck administered the oath to our new Deputy Fire Marshal, Jeff Mullaly. Born and raised in Upper Gwynedd, Mr. Mullaly remains a resident and continues to serve in the emergency services community for several organizations. Joining the Upper Gwynedd Township Fire Company (previously known as West Point Volunteer Fire Company) at the age of 16, he has served in various positions up through the rank of Fire Chief for five and a half years, and carries the title of Life Member. Working in the insurance industry for over 34 years, Mr.



Mullaly continues his education and experience in Risk Management and Safety Assessment. He has received the designation of Certified Insurance Counselor, held a past certification as an Emergency Medical Technician, and served a dozen years as a medic on the North Penn Tactical Response Team. Family members have all been involved in some manner with the emergency services as well, including his son Blaze who is now serving as an Officer within Upper Gwynedd FD. Mr. Mullaly is honored to continue to serve the community with this appointment. Congratulations and thank you, Jeff!

PARK & REC Pickeleball Update

On January 23rd, the Board of Commissioners approved the construction of four pickleball courts at Parkside Place Park. Construction is set to begin this spring and should be completed during the summer of 2017. The pickleball courts will be located adjacent to the existing tennis courts where the tennis hitting wall area resides. The hitting wall will be relocated inside the tennis courts along the back-side fence on court 5.



For those not familiar with the sport, pickleball is a racquet game created in 1965 in Washington State and combines various elements of tennis, table tennis, badminton and wiffleball. Pickleball is often referred to as one of the fastest-growing sports in America. It is designed to be a low-impact sport that also provides an excellent work out. Pickleball is typically played in teams on courts that, visually, look similar to standard tennis courts, but are much smaller. In fact, four pickleball courts can fit into roughly the same footprint as one standard tennis court.

Upper Gwynedd Township has experienced first-hand the growing popularity of pickleball. In 2014, in response to many requests by residents, the Township striped one existing tennis court for pickleball as a pilot program. Over the course of the ensuing year, usage of this court increased so steadily and dramatically, that it justified the approval of the Board to construct dedicated pickleball courts. FIRE SAFETY "What's really in your house?"



Every year, thousands of products are recalled for various

reasons. These can range from a part on your vehicle, food items, appliances, or even medicine. So, it begs the question: Do you really know what's in your home? When you purchase a new appliance, do you always fill out the product registration card? Manufacturer's use the information submitted to contact a purchaser in the event of a problem with their product. If you neglect to let them know you've purchased a product, there is no way for you to be formally notified of a problem.

Thankfully, the Federal Government has a website that you can research items that have been recalled. The website, www.recalls.gov, provides information on motor vehicles, boats, food, cosmetics and many other products that have been recalled for safety concerns. Many of the consumer products on the list are there for the potential fire hazards associated with them. Unfortunately, many people aren't aware that a product they own is under recall. The website allows you to sign up for notices about product recalls, and can direct you to the right point of contact if your product is recalled.

So, what do you do now? Take 30 minutes and go around your home to check the products that could be a fire hazard. You'll want the Make, model, and serial number to assist you. This could include refrigerators, computers, TV's, hoverboards, dehumidifiers, and other household appliances. Additionally, ANY item that uses Lithium or Lithium-Ion battery technology should be checked as there is a significant spontaneous combustion concern for certain recalled manufactured batteries

Taking the time now to check these items will keep you and your family safe in the long run.

ZONING & CODE ENFORCEMENT OVERVIEW: PLANNING AND ZONING, PART ONE

Brief History

he 1916 NYC Comprehensive Zoning Law is considered to be the first of its kind to allocate what and where specific uses and activities could take place. This code also dealt with height and setback regulations with "sky exposure plane" principals still in vogue today, 100 years later. Zoning is part of planning—it controls what happens on private property. This concept was litigated and upheld in the land mark case of Ambler Realty vs. The Village of Euclid (Ohio) 1926 before the U.S. Supreme Court. The court upheld a community's right to regulate the Use of Land on private property. In Upper Gwynedd Township, the first zoning ordinance was adopted in 1942.

Over the years, the two basic parts of the Zoning Ordinance: the text which is the body of regulations and defined terms, and the Zoning Map, which allocates land uses by designated districts have evolved through periodic amendments. In recent years, there is also a map which represents the most recent FEMA FIRM (Federal Insurance Rate Map), which identifies flood plains. The Zoning Ordinance is updated periodically. Zoning and planning activities are currently regulated by the Municipalities Planning Code, originally adopted by the PA legislature in 1968. Virtually all municipalities in Pennsylvania are regulated by the Act.

Local Planning


Planning is provided at many levels:

- The Montgomery County Planning Commission (MCPC), is active in county-wide planning re: traffic and transportation, county parks, mass transit plans (coordinated with the Delaware Valley Planning Commission) and utility master planning among many elements.
- The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission (DVRPC) provides a wide overview of planning activities for both Pennsylvania and New Jersey Counties in its jurisdiction.
- The Upper Gwynedd Township Planning Commission consists of nine township residents appointed by the Board of Commissioners. They meet monthly to consider subdivision, land development, rezoning requests and amendments to the Township Comprehensive Plan. The township planners are an advisory body, which provides recommendations to the Township Board of Commissioners.

In addition to the Planning Commission, the Zoning Hearing Board (hears appeals to the township zoning code in the form of variances, special exceptions, appeals to the interpretations of the Zoning Officer and occasionally legal challenges to the Township Zoning Ordinance or Zoning Map. This board is comprised of three members plus an alternate—all Township residents, and a solicitor.
