FROM THE CHIEF OF POLICE

Pursuant to Ordinance No. 2019-01, Upper Gwynedd Township has established a "No Knock Registry." The purpose of the registry is to protect the privacy of residents by allowing residents to register their home address. By doing so, you indicate your preference to have persons selling goods or services not come to your home and knock on your door. Spotted Lanternfly



Spotted lanternfly (SLF), *Lycorma delicatula*, is an invasive planthopper, native to Asia, that was first detected in 2014 in southeastern Pennsylvania. It feeds voraciously on many plants, including economically important crops like fruit trees, grapevines, hops, hardwoods, and ornamentals. If you think you have SLF, do not panic! First, make sure the insect you are seeing is the spotted lanternfly. Second, learn

about its life cycle and habits. Third, determine what plants it is infesting and what it is not. Fourth, employ management strategies at the proper time of the year.

Quick Facts

- SLF is a destructive invasive pest, threatening agricultural, timber, and ornamental industries, and the plants in your backyard.
- SLF is currently under quarantine in 13 counties in Pennsylvania.
- · SLF does not bite or sting.
- Stop the spread of SLF by checking your car and any outdoor equipment (grills, mowers, firewood, etc.) when going in and out of the quarantine zone.
- Manage SLF on your property by scraping eggs, banding trees, removing the favored host (tree-of-heaven), and using chemical control when appropriate.

ZONING **ENFORCEMENT**

Fences

Fences have been in the news lately on the national scene. However, locally, fences are among the most requested permit in Upper Gwynedd Township. Fence Permits are required for any new fence installation or for the replacement of an existing fence. Fence Permits are free—no township fee is required.

To legally install a new or replacement fence, patrons should complete a Consolidated Construction Permit (available online or at the Township Building) and submit an accurate plan of your property along with the proposed location of the fence. The fence contractor can be helpful in providing documentation for the permit.

It is important to include the following information on the form:

- The height of the proposed fence (the maximum height in residential districts is six feet, six inches)
- The type of fence: split rail fence, solid board on board, or solid vinyl clad fence
- Location
- Size of gates

Things to consider are:

- Property boundary
- · While a survey is not required, it is recommended in most instances
- · A fence cannot be placed over a utility easement such as for drainage or sanitary sewer
- · A fence cannot be located within the ultimate right-of-way of a street
- A fence cannot be positioned in the 100-foot clear sight triangle measured along the centerline at street intersections or in the 30 foot clear sight triangle of a driveway

Remember that the home owner is responsible to make certain that the fence is placed on their own property and does not stray onto adjacent property. A final inspection will be performed by the Township Building Code Official.

Nor-Gwyn Pool

SUMMER 2019

The Nor-Gwyn Pool summer season is right around the corner! The Commissioners, Managers and Staff of the Nor-Gwyn Pool look forward to seeing all of our members starting Memorial Day weekend! During the off-season, pool management and staff have been busy completing several projects and upgrades.

Patrons will notice three new umbrellas to the lawn area and fifteen additional Adirondack chairs around the pool. Once in the water, swimmers will notice that the shallow end now has a tiled floor. The old plaster floor needed to be replaced, which provided an opportunity to upgrade to a tile surface using the latest repair techniques and materials. Look for additional resurfacing over the coming years.

Less obvious, but equally important improvements made this year include new drainage and decking around the pool building. It is critical that the Nor-Gwyn Pool maintains a clean, attractive and safe deck around the building to ensure patron safety. The Nor-Gwyn Pool Commissioners, Managers and Staff would like to acknowledge the dedication of the pool maintenance team. Thank you for providing routine opening, closing and off-season maintenance as well as updating the first-aid room and staff areas.

Pool registration opened on March 15th. With high registration numbers expected again for the 2019 summer, new members are encouraged to register early to ensure a spot for this season. Returning patrons will receive priority registration but are likewise encouraged to register early to beat the rush in May and early June.

This year, there are two registration changes that may affect patrons with younger children. First, all children one year of age and older, as of May 15th will now need to register as members and will be included in the fee calculation. This is a change from our prior two-year old membership requirement. Second, ALL children must now be listed on family members' profiles regardless of age, although children under the age of one (as of May 15th) will not need a membership card and will be admitted free.]

Fire Safety GRILL SAFETY

As the warmer months approach, the using of outdoor grills for cooking will increase. Whether it be



charcoal, propane or natural gas, please keep in mind the following safety tips:

- Before using a grill, ensure that the connection between the fuel line and the grill is secured.
- Grills should be at least 15 feet from any combustibles, including a wood deck.
- If using charcoal, use a minimal amount of lighter fluid. Do not add lighter fluid once the fire has been ignited.
- Dispose of hot coals properly. Douse them with water and stir to make sure the fire is out. Never place them in a plastic, paper or wooden container.

- Most grill fires are caused by excess or leftover grease from previous cooking.
 While that may "add flavor," it also adds to the potential of an out of control fire.
- Never leave a grill unattended. Having "eyes-on" can reduce or prevent an incident before it happens.
- Matches and lighters should be kept away from children.

On average, about 9,600 house fires are caused each year by outdoor cooking, with July being the busiest month. Over 16,500 people were required to go to the Emergency Room because of injuries, with half of them being thermal burns. Of the US households with an outdoor grill, 82% of the fires were caused by gas or propane grills. For more info visit www.nfpa.org.

Public Works HIT THE ROAD, JACK!

Potholes

Warm weather results in an increase of local traffic patterns. Summer is unfortunately pothole season. Upper Gwynedd Township's Public Works department maintains just over 54 miles of roadway within the township. Major roads are maintained by either the state or the county.

County Roads: Sumneytown Pike from Swedesford Road to Prospect Ave. and from 400 feet west of Broad Street to Valley Forge Road; West Point Pike; and South Broad Street from Sumneytown Pike to Lansdale Borough are maintained by the **county**. To report road damage, contact Montgomery County Roads and Bridges, 610-278-3612.

State Roads: Welsh Road/East Main Street/Route 63; Route 202; Valley Forge Road/Route 63; Allentown Road; Dekalb Pike; Morris Road; and North Wales Road are maintained by the **state**. To report damage on these roads, contact PennDOT at 610-275-2368. To report damage to roads within Upper Gwynedd Township, or for questions, call our Public Works department at 215-699-7777.

Smooth Sailing: Several township neighborhoods are scheduled for roadway projects this year. Some are scheduled for milling and overlay, which means the top one-and-a-half inches of the road will be ground off and the road will be reblacktopped and have ADA ramps installed in certain areas. Other roads are slated to be micro-surfaced with Ralumac®, a thin coating that extends the life of the road and helps prevent potholes. Residents of affected roads will be notified prior to the paving projects.


