Board of Commissioners APPROVE 2019 BUDGET

he Upper Gwynedd Township Board of Commissioners approved the 2019 budget at their December 17, 2018 Public Meeting. This budget relates to all funds of the Township including the General Fund, Sanitary Sewer Fund, and the Liquid Fuels Fund. The 2019 budget does not include a real estate tax increase.

The Township is proud to announce that it will maintain the \$30,000 Homestead Exemption that many residents benefit from. This exemption reduces owner occupied residential assessed values in the amount of \$30,000, thereby reducing the amount paid to the Township. Anyone not registered for the Homestead exemption, may acquire additional information and registration forms via the Township's website.

With respect to sewer rates, the Township has not increased sewer rates.

The Township's Liquid Fuels Fund outlines how the funds received by PennDOT via the State's Liquid Fuel Tax is spent. These expenditures include the milling and overlaying of streets located in Upper Gwynedd Township. The streets contained in the 2019 budget are from a list that is contained in an annual road maintenance schedule. This schedule is reviewed each year to determine whether there are streets that need attention, but are not included in the current year's plan. A list of streets included in the 2019 budget is also posted on the Township's website.

2019 Budget CONTINUED FROM COVER

It is very important for taxpayers to understand that the Township does not control the tax levy imposed by either the North Penn School District or the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners. In 2018, the Township real estate tax represented only 6.5% of your total annual real estate tax bill while the School District's tax represented 81.2%, the County tax represented 11.0%, and the Community College tax represented 1.3%.

In summary, the Budget contains a spending plan that includes revenues and expenditures as follows:

In addition to normal operation and maintenance expenses, this Budget includes the following capital items:

General Fund: *Administration:* Purchase and installation of a Township-Wide accounting software replacement (\$100k); *Facilities:* Replacement of a section of the Administrative Building roof (\$30k - funded by Capital Reserves); *Police:* Replacement of two patrol vehicle (\$78k - funded by Capital Reserves) and the purchase of five body cameras (\$10k); *Public Works:* Road milling & overlay projects (\$763k - of which \$523k funded by State), storm water management projects (\$660k – of which \$138k funded by Grants and \$397k funded by Capital Reserves), ADA projects (\$155k), bridge repairs (\$872k – of which \$218k funded by Capital Reserves), and purchase of a backhoe (\$150k – funded by Capital Reserves); *Park & Rec:* West Point basketball court repair (24k - funded by Capital Reserves), Center Street Path improvements (\$15k), and Sumneytown Pike Bridge landscape improvements (\$40k).

Sanitary Sewer Fund: The continuation of the Inflow/Infiltration Reduction Program (\$301k - \$301k funded by Capital Reserves), various equipment / controls replacement and upgrades at Plant (\$586k - \$100k funded by a Grant and \$155k funded by Capital Reserves), and the replacement of a utility truck (\$48k).

Sanitary Sewer: Diversion Project Fund: The continuation of the design engineering of diversion project as well as construction starting 4th Quarter 2018 (\$12,995,000 – \$11,658,008 funded from Capital Reserves and \$1,336,992 from a bank loan).

The Board of Commissioners' President Kenneth E. Kroberger thanked all the Members of the Board, Interim Township Manager Alex Kaker, Township Finance Director David Brill, and all Department Heads for their diligence through the Budget preparation process. Mr. Kroberger added that many difficult choices were made to develop a Budget which maintained and improved service while holding the line on costs thereby no tax increase.

Public Works SNOW EMERGENCY INFORMATION

A snow emergency shall be declared by the Township Manager and announced over the radio stations WNPV 1440 and KYW 1060. Emergency information and snow plow techniques will also be posted on www. uppergwynedd.org. Township policy dictates a rotational plow schedule with each snowfall. This means no one neighborhood or street remains in the same position on the plow schedule. Township plows must operate at a minimum speed to create enough momentum to remove snow from the road. A truck with a raised plow does not mean your area has been completed. They may be returning to the garage for fuel, additional materials, assisting in an emergency, etc. The state and county are responsible for state and county roads. Private roads and private lanes are not the Township's responsibility. For information on the plowing process, visit the Public Works Department page at www.uppergwynedd.org.

Follow these simple do's and don'ts of residential snow removal to help our operators remove snow with ease.

- Trim back low hanging branches to allow plow operators a clear line of sight.
- Clear your sidewalk within 24 hours as it is residential property as this is not the Township's responsibility.

DO NOT

- Put out trash and recycling containers.
- Park unattended vehicles on any Township roadway (Ordinance 61-2).
 Vehicles in the roadway will be ticketed and towed.
- Leave basketball stands in the street.
- Shovel snow into the street.
- Pass a plow while on the road and stay out of the operators' blind spot.

Please remember that our plow operators work diligently to clear safe roadways for Township residents. Please be patient during snowfall.

Sewer Department

A friendly reminder: please do not flush anything down the toilet other than toilet paper! Items such as flushable wipes and feminine hygiene products do not degrade as they travel down sewer pipes. Wipes become hung up or lodged in the lateral pipe leaving the home which can cause slow drainage from sinks and bathtubs or even a sewer backup into your home. In addition to clogging pipes, upon arrival at the treatment plant or a sewage pump station, these items will become lodged in pumps causing them to clog up and fail. It is costly to fix on a regular basis. In addition to hygiene products, grease should not be disposed of down the drain. As the grease cools, it begins to solidify and sticks to the inside of pipes. This will reduce the diameter and flow rate which increases the chances of debris building up. Often, the grease will cause a complete blockage of the pipe over time. Think before you flush!

FIRE SAFETY Need More Power?

The electrical system in our homes is designed to provide adequate power, while using a built-in safety system to keep hazards in check. The breaker panel, which is located in either the garage or basement of most homes, provides that safety measure. Most homes built today offer a minimum of 200 Ampere (Amp) service to a residence, which is more than adequate. In the past, anything from 30-100 Amp service was the norm. As technology grew, so did the demand for power. Within older homes, there may not be enough power to support central air conditioning, ondemand water heaters, or many other appliances that require a large draw of electricity. If you've ever experienced a "tripped breaker" while using a hair dryer or microwave, this is the result of asking for too much electricity from the wire(s). The gauge of the wire going to your outlet from your breaker panel dictates the amount of electricity that can safely pass through. The breaker within the panel acts as a shut-off device for each wire from the panel.

Many homes in the township have upgraded their service to 200 amp to alleviate tripped breakers. If you are considering the same, please understand that upgrading the overall electric coming into a residence will not stop this problem. The wires from the breaker panel would still be the same size and the same size breaker, although new, would be installed on an upgraded panel.

A certified electrician can test the appliances and circuits in your home to determine the best course of action, According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), between 2010 & 2014, an average of 69% of residential electrical fires were related to the wiring and related equipment, resulting in 400 deaths and \$1.2 billion in direct fire damage annually.
