SNOW EMERGENCY INFORMATION



A snow emergency shall be declared by the Township

Manager and announced over the radio stations WNPV 1440 and KYW 1060. Emergency information and snow plow techniques will also be posted on www.uppergwynedd.org.

Township policy dictates a rotational plow schedule with each snowfall. This means no one neighborhood or street remains in the same position on the plow schedule. Township plows must operate at a minimum speed to create enough momentum to remove snow from the road.

A truck with a raised plow does not mean your area has been completed. They may be returning to the garage for fuel, additional materials, assisting in an emergency, etc. The state and county are responsible for state and county roads. Private roads and private lanes are not the Township's responsibility.

Wastewater Improvement Program (WIP)

LEARN MORE ABOUT OUR TOWNSHIP INITIATIVE

Driving around town you may have noticed crews working in select areas as part of the Township's Wastewater Improvement Program.

What is Upper Gwynedd's Wastewater Improvement Program?

The Wastewater Improvement Program will expand the sewer infrastructure to allow UGT the ability to divert the current wastewater being sent to the Towamencin Municipal Authority back to Upper Gwynedd Township's Wastewater Treatment Plant.

There are several environmental reasons for the WIP. The diversion of wastewater back to UGT has a positive environmental impact and increases the quality of service to residents. As a result of this expansion, there will be fewer incidents of sanitary sewer overflows that can have a negative impact on the environment.

In addition, Upper Gwynedd's state of the art Wastewater treatment plant, includes the innovative Bio-Mag system, and Ultra-Violet (UV) disinfection of wastewater which significantly reduce the number of chemicals being released into our streams as a result of treatment. Both systems allow us to meet anticipated future environmental treatment standards. In addition to environmental reasons, there are also positive long-

term financial benefits to this program. This project will allow Upper Gwynedd Township resident's taxpayer dollars to be invested in Upper Gwynedd Township's infrastructure, as opposed to another wastewater treatment plant. It allows for additional investment into an already state of the art facility.

When will this project start and how will it impact residents?

Since this project may create a traffic detours and impact residents the Township has created a website to keep everyone informed—you can visit www.uppergwynedd.org/wip. The diversion of wastewater back to UGT has a positive environmental impact and increases the quality of service to residents.

As a result of this expansion, there will be far less incidents of sanitary sewer overflows that can have a negative impact on the environment.

Crews will be centralized to specific areas at a given time. All project schedules will be kept up to date and posted on this site. Due to weather and variables inherit in construction projects, the schedule will be subject to change. This website page will be the main source of information and will be constantly updated with new information. The Township will also be posting information to social media to spread this information to residents.

Fire Safety Portable space heaters




With winter upon us, many folks will be using portable space heaters to provide a little extra comfort at home or at work. Before doing so, you should know the basics in order to keep the area safe with these appliances. Each year, over 25,000 fires occur in the home due to heating equipment, resulting in over 300 fatalities, and 6,000 injuries. Portable space heaters can be a convenient source of supplemental heat for your home in cold weather. Unfortunately, they can pose significant fire and electric shock hazards if not used properly. Fire and electrical hazards can be caused by space heaters without adequate safety features, space heaters placed near combustibles, or space heaters that are improperly plugged in. To note, many businesses do not permit the use the space heaters at all. If you want to bring a heater to work, first check with your employer to see if it is permitted. If you are allowed to bring one to work, or choose to have one in your residence, please follow the following as per the International Fire Code:

- All portable electric space heaters shall be listed and labeled. This means that the appliance has been tested by Underwriters Laboratories (UL) or another Nationally Recognized Testing Laboratory.
- Portable heaters shall only be plugged into an approved receptacle.
 Portable electric heaters are not to be used with an extension cord.
 Extension cords are not designed to handle the load that is required for a heater in use.
- A minimum of three feet clearance on all sides of the heater are required when near any combustibles. This will prevent radiant heating and subsequent ignition of nearby products.
- Never leave a space heater unattended. Turn it off when you're leaving a room or going to sleep, and don't let pets or children play too close to a space heater.
- Place space heaters on level, flat surfaces. Never place heaters on cabinets, tables, furniture, or carpet, which can overheat and start a fire.

Public Works "MILLING AND OVERLAY" VS. "MICRO-SURFACING"


Several Township neighborhoods have had their roads worked on over the summer and into the fall. Some were milled and overlaid, others were micro-surfaced. What does each mean, exactly? Milling and Overlay involves the top one-and-a-half inches of the road surface being ground off and the road then re-blacktopped. About three years after a road has been re-blacktopped, we have contractors micro-surface the road with Ralumac[®].

What is Ralumac?

Ralumac is a cold-applied asphalt-like material designed for all types of surfaces. Its effectiveness as an overlay carpet is derived from a Bitumen Emulsion, a binder which, when mixed with high quality aggregates and fillers, gives a

material with excellent stability in summer and winter.

How does micro-surfacing work?

Ralumac is applied using self-contained mixing and laying equipment that continuously blends the separately loaded components in a job mix formula. It is then applied in a thin coat, sets quickly and can be driven on in about one hour. When applying the Ralumac to road surfaces, the contractor must overlap his paving passes to get full coverage. This process causes ridges to appear at these overlaps and leaves the road with a gritty appearance, but traffic wears down any irregularities in the paving surface and smooths them down in a relatively short time.

Ralumac micro-surfacing lasts 6-9 years and extends the life of the roads significantly. Using the process as part of the Township's preventative road maintenance program will decrease the need to use the milling-and-overlay practice.

Currently the majority of the Township's road maintenance budget goes to millingand-overlay, which costs \$70 per square yard, opposed to Micro-Surfacing's \$2.50 per square yard cost. The more that roads are micro-surfaced, the less need there will be for Milling and Overlaying, at a great savings to taxpayers.

CODE ENFORCEMENT Helpful Reminders

- As a reminder with the winter months arriving, please take time to have your heating equipment checked for proper operation especially for the connection to the chimney where the products of combustion leave the heater to prevent the buildup of carbon monoxide fumes.
- In the event of snow, the Township ordinance requires sidewalks to be cleared with a 24 inches wide clear path within 24 hours after snow has ceased to fall.
- In order to assist first responders in identifying properties, the township property ordinance requires house numbers to be posted conspicuously on the street side of each property, the entrance gatepost or beside your property. With a snow fall house numbers painted on curbs may not be visible.
- Once spring arrives, if there is a deck on the property have it checked for signs of deterioration around connections and wood members.
- Brush, weeds and grass must be cut if in excess of 12 inches.
- Abandoned motor vehicles are not permitted on properties, please contact the Township as to what constitutes an abandoned vehicle.

Many people do not realize the serious damage that could occur to

their home plumbing system and the township infrastructure while doing something as insignificant as cooking a meal. Whether its cooking a big breakfast for the family on Sunday mornings or making your favorite snack for the big game, just about everything we cook will create fats, oils, and grease, which, if not disposed of correctly can cause a clog in the sewer pipe, resulting in a nasty mess of sewage spilling into your home or all over the front lawn. This would surely ruin everyone's appetite! Fats, Oils, and Grease, commonly referred to as FOG, can pose a significant risk to your home sewer line and the township's sanitary sewer system. Typically, FOG is created in the kitchen while preparing food. Everything from poultry products, baked goods, dairy products, fried foods, and just about everything in between, will create FOG.

A lifelong county resident, Ruth Damsker served her community for her entire adult life, as an elected official and volunteer. Her community service was



recognized by various organizations and rewarded by voters who appreciate and respect Ruth's advocacy for government reform and fiscal responsibility. Ruth was elected Cheltenham Finance Officer and appointed Controller for 12 years earning her a reputation as a fiscal watchdog. As meals are prepared, cookware washed, and food scraps discarded down the garage disposal, the FOG gets washed down the drain. The fats, oils, and grease will separate from the wash water, settle in the drain pipe, and begin to cool. Once the FOG has cooled down it will harden, causing the pipe to become more and more restricted. Eventually the pipe becomes so restricted that nothing can pass through, creating a full blockage. Blockages can happen in both the residential sewer laterals and/or the township's sanitary sewer lines. In both cases, it can be environmentally unsafe, extremely messy, and very costly to correct.

> As a township, we spend a considerable amount of resources combating FOG issues to prevent sanitary sewer overflows in our sewer collections system. However, we need your help by being good environmental stewards and not dumping FOG down the drain!

Now that you know risks associated with FOG, here are some tips to help you dispose of FOG the proper way.

- Pour fats, oils, and grease into a tin or can (a coffee can or anything that will not melt, shall work) and let the FOG cool down. Once hardened simply dispose the can into your trashcan.
- Scrape pots and pans with paper towel prior to washing in sink. Throw paper towel into trash.



- Throw food scraps into trash instead of down garbage disposal. If you have a garden, you can compost most scraps including any leftover fruits, veggies, dairy products, coffee grinds, and meats.
- Use a sink strainer that covers the kitchen sink drain and helps prevent debris from falling into the drain.
- Educate children about FOG and teach them early about proper food preparation and disposal.


